- How much is my compensation?
 - You will be paid \$12-15 per hour with potential for bonuses or promotions based on student retention and parent satisfaction.
- What programming languages do instructors teach?
 - Our curriculum is quite broad-based. We are looking for instructors who can teach any of the following – Scratch, HTML/CSS, JavaScript, Python, or Java, and/or experience or understanding of web accessibility standards.
- What does a typical schedule look like?
 - The highest availability of summer classes is between 9 am 6:30pm EST
 Monday Friday, however additional classes may be available for evening and weekends.
- How many classes might I be teaching?
 - This varies greatly depending on your availability and experience, but you should anticipate between 5-10 classes per week, or more if working with our adults.
- How long will I need to teach?
 - Summer classes take place in June, July, and sometimes August. Longer term contracts may be made available after the summer session.
